Class News...

Oak Class

Another busy week for the children in Oak Class! They have continued to look at formal language in English and produced another impressive persuasive letter, again on the topic of plastic pollution. They have been able to use emotive language, giving strongly worded writing, outlining their reasons and viewpoints. Oak Class have really excelled at this skill!

In History, the children have been really engaged with our census work, where we have been investigating the life of a particular individual, Mary Bucktrout, using the census and historical records. If you ask, "What happened to Mary Bucktrout?" they will be able to detail what happened to her and give explanations as to what her life was like. We aim to develop our skills



at using the census and investigate a local house/ or street to find clues to the past and people who lived there.

In Science we have continued our work on dissolving. We have looked at the weight of a solute (solid) within a solution and discovered that there are approximately 20 teaspoons of sugar in a can of coca cola! We have also grown our very own crystals using Epsom salts!

Chick Update



The chicks thoroughly enjoyed the long weekend break with Miss Archer and have certainly started to grow in size, strength and personality. What a rowdy bunch they are!

This week they settled back into the classroom and the children were eggstremely excited to see them again. We have spent time observing the chicks and making sure that they have plenty of food and water to help them grow. Each of our chicks is unique in breed, size, markings and behaviour and we have even started thinking of names to suit them. It has been lovely to hear them chatting away while we work. We hope that the children will be able to begin carefully handling them next week.

In science this week, the children spent time in the forest exploring and observing the different trees we have. We talked about the different parts of the tree and their functions. We also checked in on our sunflowers which have been thriving beautifully.

In Literacy, the children have been designing their very own space monsters and have then written a description for their monster using exciting adjectives and verbs.



We also linked our work in Literacy with our computing work and the children have been learning how to write on the computer. On Friday, the children had a go at typing a letter to their lost toy. We learnt how to use the space bar and backspace buttons.

Welcome to our nursery news!

This week Willow class have been enjoying provision outside in the sunshine. Together we have explored dinosaurs in the play foam and dinosaurs in the compost tray.

During our maths sessions we have been drawing dinosaur shadows using chalks and creating dinosaurs using 2D shapes.

We enjoyed group story time underneath the tree where we set up a teddy bears picnic for our children to enjoy.

During our forest sessions we have taken part in bark and leaf rubbings whilst still enjoying the beautiful bluebells.

We used modelling materials to create dinosaurs and collage materials to create spring lambs.

Our sound of the week was 'y' so we have been learning words with the initial sound 'y' such as 'yo-yo, yellow and yap'. We have also been oral blending cvc words.
